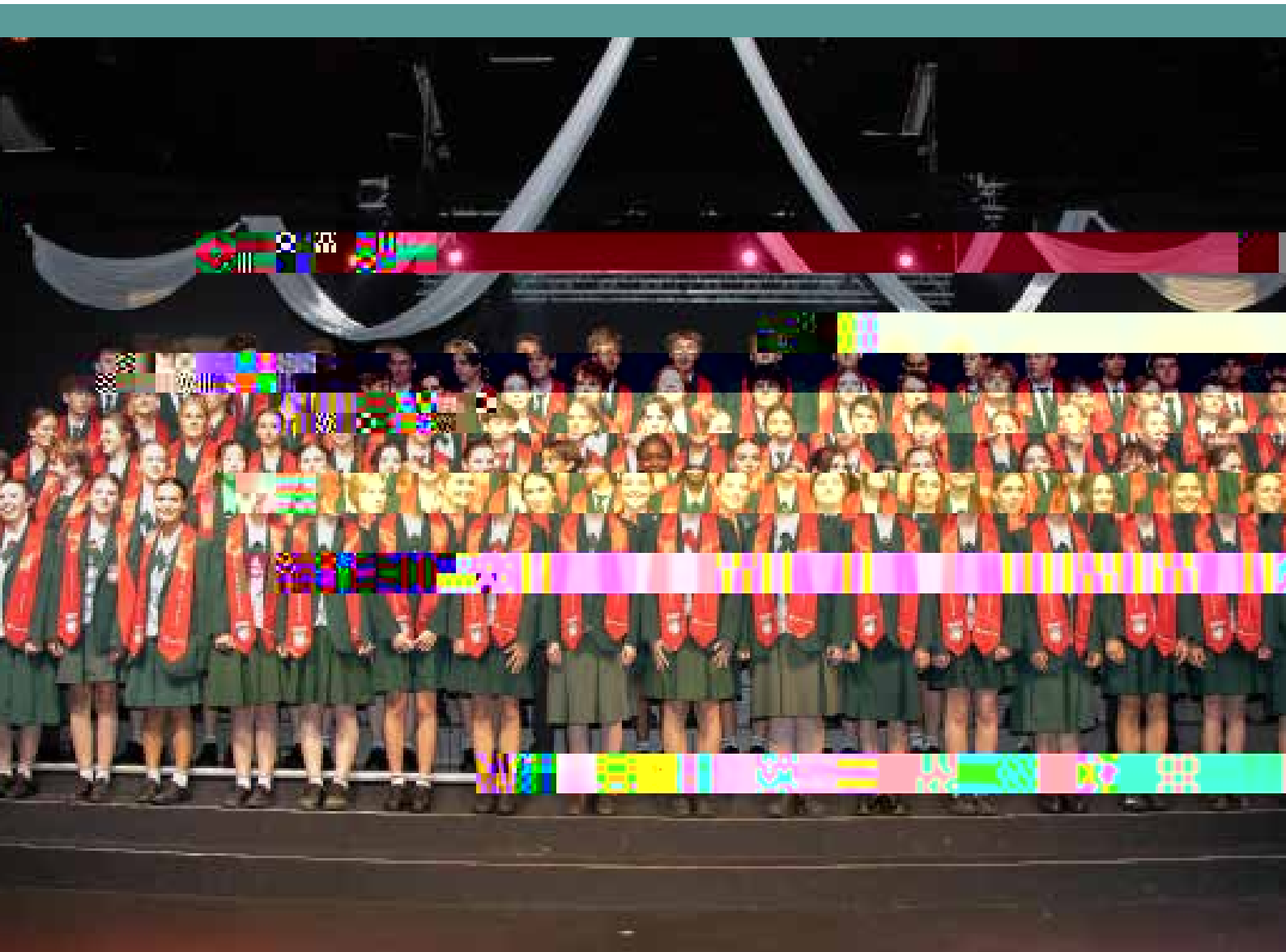

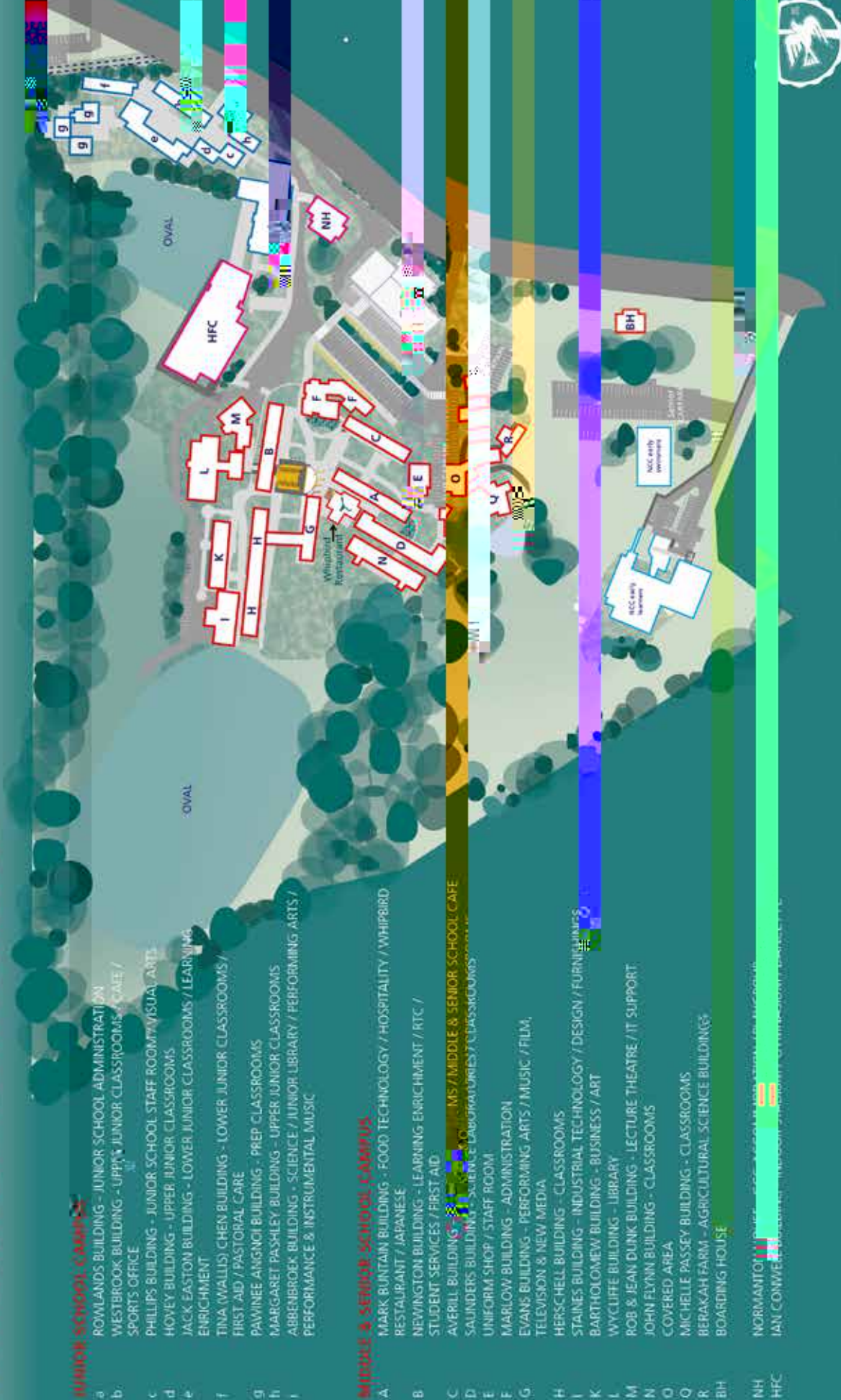
JANUARY TRADING HOURS

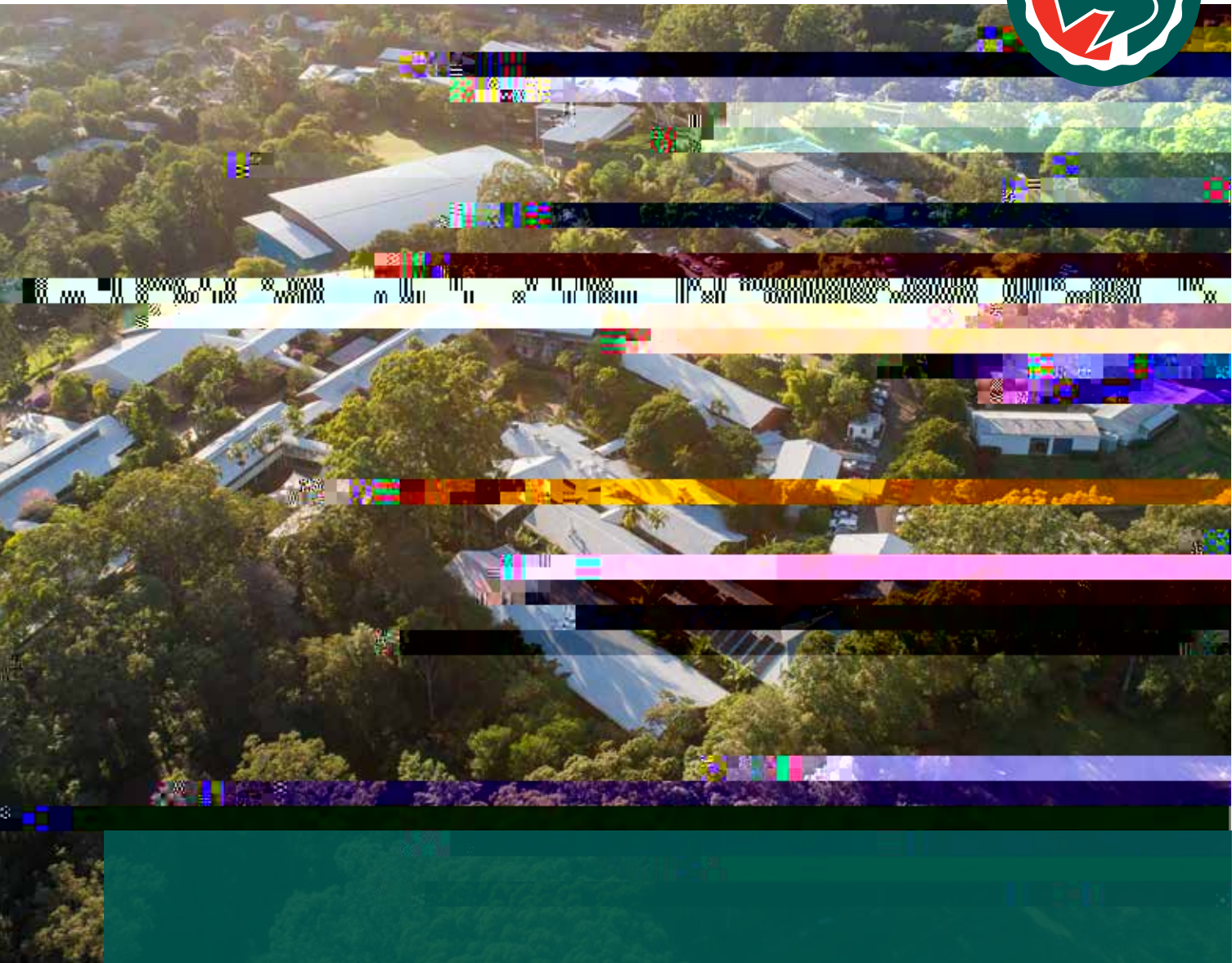
