STUDENT PROGRESS, ATTENDANCE AND COURSE DURATION POLICY

This policy is available to staf and to students.

Overseas students are required to meet and maintain sat sfactory course progress and at endance requirements under visa condit on 8202 and under Standard 8 of the National Code of Practice for Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2018.

- 1. Course Progress
 - a) The College will monitor, record and assess the course progress of each student for the course in which the student is currently enrolled.
 - b) The course progress of all students will be assessed at the end of each study period /semester of enrolment according to Nambour Christ an College's course assessment requirements.
 - c) Students who have begun part way through a semester will be assessed according to Nambour Christ an College's course assessment requirements af er complet ng one full study period.
 - d) Students will need to demonstrate sat sfactory course progress in any study period.

- e) If at the end of a study period a student does not achieve sat sfactory course progress as described above, the Head of School will formally contact the parent(s) to advise that the student is at o Q a

- f) A copy of the student's individual strategy for academic improvement and any relevant progress reports will be forwarded to parents. Parents will be advised if the proposed strategy has any implications for fees payable, the student's progression through a package of courses, or the student's visa. Where a proposed intervent on plan has significant implications for the student's course of study (as originally agreed), anew writen agreement will need to be established. A new CoE may also be required.
- g) The student's individual strategy for academic improvement will be monitored over the following study



- period by the Head of School and records of student response to the strategy will be kept. Parents will be kept informed of the student's academic progress while the student is receiving formal intervent on.
- h) If the student does not achieve sat sfactory course progress by the end of the next study period, Nambour Christ an College will advise the student in writing of its intention to report the student for breach of visa condition 8202, and that he/she has 20 working days in which to access the school's internal complaints and
